

CALL FOR PAPERS

21st Biennial Interdisciplinary Conference of Netherlandic Studies (ICNS)

On Friday, June 9, and Saturday, June 10, 2023, the biennial Interdisciplinary Conference for Netherlandic Studies will take place in Madison, Wisconsin.

The theme of the conference will be: **The Future of Dutch Studies: A Broader Perspective of Language, Image, and Culture.**

For this conference, the scope of Dutch Studies encompasses a wide spectrum of fields and disciplines (art, design, history, literature, musicology, linguistics, language studies, etc.) as well as a range of approaches and schools of thought, from Eurocentered epistemes to decoloniality.

Topics of general sessions might feature any literary, cultural, or art-historical period such as (but not limited to): Early-Modern, 19th- & 20th-Century Literature, 16th-Century Art & Literature, Colonialism, Early-Modern Literature, 20th-Century History, Early-Modern Art History, 17th-Century Art, Afrikaans, Linguistics, 20th-Century Film, 19th- & 20th-Century Literature, and Local Dutch-American History.

Select papers may be included in a conference publication to follow. Graduate students are especially encouraged to participate. Four travel grants of €500 each will be awarded to graduate students who present a paper.

For consideration, please submit an abstract of 250 words and a one page bio to <u>ineke.huysman@huygens.knaw.nl</u> with "ICNS Abstract" in the subject line **by December 15, 2022.** Acceptance notifications will be given by February 1,2023.

Registration will begin after February 1, 2023.

AANS membership is required in order to attend the conference.
